

Zuidasdok in full swing May – September 2025



Zuidasdok is one of the largest infrastructural projects in the Netherlands. The project aims to improve the accessibility of Amsterdam and the northern part of the Randstad, both by road and by public transport.

Zuidasdok is a collaboration between Rijkswaterstaat, ProRail and the City of Amsterdam.

Throughout 2025, Zuidasdok will be working flat-out on the widening of the A10 Zuid and the redevelopment of Amsterdam Zuid station. This causes a lot of inconvenience for road users and train passengers. Between May and September, the following periods are the main ones to be aware of in advance:

- **28 May 10:00 pm to 2 June 5:00 am (Ascension weekend)**

Closures A4 and A10 Zuid – No trains to and from Amsterdam Zuid

The A4 in the direction of Amsterdam will be closed for traffic coming from the direction of Schiphol Airport between junctions Badhoevedorp and De Nieuwe Meer. The A4 can still be used by traffic coming from Haarlem/Alkmaar. The connecting lanes from A4 to A10 West and from A10 Zuid to the A10 West will be closed.

On the A10 Zuid, two lanes in the direction A1 Hengelo and A2 Utrecht will be closed. From 29 May 1:00 am, no trains will be running to or from Amsterdam Zuid station.

- **6 June 10:00 pm to 10 June 5:00 am (Pentecost weekend)**

No connection possible between A10 Zuid and A10 West

The connection between the A10 Zuid and the A10 West will be closed.

- **13 June 10:00 pm to 16 June 5:00 am**

Closure of A4 and A10 Zuid – No trains to or from Amsterdam Zuid station

The A4 and A10 Zuid will be closed from junction Badhoevedorp in the direction A1 Hengelo and A2 Utrecht.

Motorway access via S109 in the direction of A10 Oost and the A2 will also be closed. On 14 and 15 June there will be no trains running to or from Amsterdam Zuid station.

- **26 June 9:00 pm to 12 July 9:00 pm**

Closure of A4, A10 Zuid and A10 Oost

The A4, A10 Zuid and A10 Oost in the direction A1 Hengelo and A2 Utrecht will be closed between junctions Badhoevedorp and Watergraafsmeer.

There will be fewer trains than normal to and from Amsterdam Zuid station.

- **11 July – 20 August**

Closure of Amstelveenseweg at A10 Zuid – Reduced train services to and from Amsterdam Zuid station

Amstelveenseweg will be closed for motorised traffic in both directions where it crosses the A10 Zuid.

Buses will continue to use Amstelveenseweg.

The S108 access and exit routes will remain open.

The metro stop can also be reached via the west side of Amstelveenseweg.

Tram 24 will not run at all for one week, starting 12 July.

Travel advice

Noise pollution

The building works may lead to noise pollution, also in the evenings and overnight. At various locations, foundation piles and sheet piles have to be driven into the ground for instance, and the sandy soil needs to be compacted with vibratory rammers. The loudest activities will be carried out during the day, so that overnight disturbances to residents are kept to a minimum.
