Dear resident, business owner or other interested party,

We would like to give you an overview of the building works that will take place up to the end of September, for the redevelopment and extension of Amsterdam Zuid station. These activities are part of Zuidasdok, which involves the widening and tunnelling of the A10 Zuid and the complete redevelopment of Amsterdam Zuid station.

# 24 July to 1 October: Parnassusweg closed for car traffic (going out of the city)

Metro 52 (Noord-Zuid) currently arrives at the final stop Zuid on a single track. In the future, there will be two tracks, which will be extended across Parnassusweg via an additional metro viaduct. Amongst other things, we are now building part of the foundation for this additional metro viaduct, as well as a support pillar on Parnassusweg.



What does this mean for you? Between 24 July and 1 October, these activities mean that we will be diverting cars and buses going in a southern direction (Amstelveen) via Strawinskylaan, Beethovenstraat and De Boelaan and then back onto Parnassusweg. The diversion route will be indicated by traffic signs along the road. During this period, cyclists and pedestrians will be able to keep using Parnassusweg in both directions.

### 5 to 14 August: A4 and A10 Zuid closed for 8 days, fewer trains

From Saturday 5 August 10:00 pm to Monday 14 August 5:00 am, we expect major traffic disruptions. During these 8 days, the A4 and the A10 Zuid will be closed from junction Badhoevedorp up to the RAI motorway access on route S109, for traffic in the direction A1 Hengelo and A2 Utrecht. During this period, we will push two roof components under the A10 and the railway tracks. We will remove the asphalt, railway tracks and train platform, before digging up the ground over a length of 100 metres and pushing the roof components into their positions.



### What does this mean for you?

You should allow for additional travel time of up to one hour. Traffic will be diverted via the A5 and the A9. Traffic in the direction of Schiphol Airport can use the A10 Zuid as usual. Amsterdam Zuid station will remain accessible by train, on an adjusted timetable, and metro, according to the regular timetable.

# 1 August to 30 September: Closure of Matthijs Vermeulenpad

From 1 August, we will be removing cables, pipes and grout anchors from the underground where the future motorway tunnel will be realised. We will lift 16 sheet piles measuring just over 13 metres each; considering the safety of passers-by, this means that Matthijs Vermeulenpad has to be closed completely. Cyclists and pedestrians will be notified well in advance, by signs and cycling coaches.

# 14/15 and 26/27 August: A10 Zuid closed for two evenings/nights

From Monday 14 August 10:00 pm to Tuesday 15 August 6:00 am and from Saturday 26 August 10:00 pm to Sunday 27 August 6:00 am we will be carrying lifting work along the A10 Zuid near Amsterdam Zuid station. Traffic in the direction A4 The Hague and Schiphol Airport will be diverted via A2/A9 Schiphol/Haarlem and the A10 Noord. Both the closure and diversion route will be communicated by means of traffic signs. The routing from the A10 Zuid to A1 Hengelo and A2 Utrecht will be accessible as usual. Consult Waze or TomTom Go before you set off.

# 19 to 27 August: Modified metro timetable to extend metro platform

This platform will be extended because the metro security system will be modified in preparation for a subsequent phase of construction work. Because the platform will be extended in length, we will also relocate the travel information screen and several cameras. During these activities, metros 51 and 52 will run according to a modified timetable and depart from the other metro platform. Plan your travel in advance with the GVB-app.

# 8 to 11 September and 22 to 25 September: A10 Zuid closed for two weekends, fewer metros

From 8 September 10:00 pm to 11 September 5:00 am and 22 September 10:00 pm to 25 September 5:00 am we expect major traffic disruptions on the south side of Amsterdam. The A10 Zuid is then closed for traffic in the direction of A4 Schiphol and The Hague, from junction Amstel to the VUMC motorway entrance on access route S108. You may have to allow for up to one hour additional travel time. During these weekends, we will be working on three locations between the metro tracks and the A10 Zuid.

### What does this mean for you?

Allow for additional travel time of up to one hour. Traffic will be diverted via the A9 and the A10 Noord. Traffic in the direction A1 Hengelo and A2 Utrecht can keep using the A10 Zuid outer ring road as usual. Metros will run according to a modified timetable. You can use the QR-code on the first page to connect to WhatsApp and ask questions about driving and traveling during the building activities. You can do the same via www.askandgo.nl.

### Go explore from the Zuidas Summer Shack

Between 20 July and 12 August, the Zuidas Summer Shack will be located on Gustav Mahlerplein. Just like last year, we will organise lots of activities that are not just interesting, but also good fun. You can sign up for fun and surprising activities.
